

ABOUT THE JULIETTE PROGRAM

The Juliette program is Girl Scouting custom-made for you! It's a great way to mix and match your unique interests with Girl Scout participation – special events, weekend workshops, leadership projects, or travel opportunities that improve your skills and meet your interests and needs.

Girl Scout Juliettes are busy, independent, self-confident girls and young women who want to be a part of something larger – Girl Scouts! Meeting in troops is one way to be a part of the Girl Scout experience, but when there aren't available troops in your area, your troop no longer meets, or you become too busy with extracurricular activities or sports, becoming a Juliette will allow you to continue your Girl Scout experience on an individual basis.

The Juliette program is available to all girls in Kindergarten through 12th grade. It is especially popular for girls ages 11-17 who love the Girl Scout program but are very busy with other activities.

As a Girl Scout Juliette, you can participate in everything that is open to your grade level. You can attend council-sponsored programs such as events, series opportunities, year-round camp experiences, and travel opportunities.

As a Juliette, you will work on Girl Scout programs with a parent or another adult mentor. You will decide what activities to participate in and which awards you wish to complete. Girl Scout Juliettes can earn the Journey awards and badges as well as the Girl Scout Bronze, Silver, and Gold Awards.

Becoming a Girl Scout Juliette can help you continue your own personal leadership adventure!

GIRL SCOUT LEADERSHIP EXPERIENCE (GSLE)

The National Leadership Journeys and The Girl's Guide to Girl Scouting are two combined components that make up the Girl Scout Leadership Experience and the National Program Portfolio. Combined with the cookie program, travel experiences, and Girl Scout awards, the Girl Scout Leadership Experience is designed to help girls everywhere develop as leaders and build confidence by learning new skills. It also ensures that Girl Scouts at every level are sharing a powerful, national experience—girls together changing the world!

There are seven National Leadership Journeys:

You can work with an adult to determine the format for your Journey. You can decide how long you'd like the Journey to last, what you'd like the Journey to be about, what type of field trips to take, and which experts to add. In this way, each Journey can be as personal, intriguing, and educational as you would like.

In addition to the Journeys, there are also badges, which help build skills. These badges, along with essential Girl Scout information, are outlined in each level's Girl's Guide to Girl Scouting. This guide is a colorful, easy-to-use binder that is also specially designed for girls at each age level. It holds a handbook, information on bridging and our highest awards, Girl Scout history, tradition, and much more! It also helps girls tie their badges and Journeys together to create an amazing experience!



Older Girl Tip!

The Think Like a Citizen Scientist!, Think Like an Engineer!, and Think Like a Programmer! Journeys are not currently available for girls in grades 6-12, but are coming soon! While we wait for these new Journeys, check the events calendar to find STEM-related activities in your area now!

MEMBERSHIP dues

Girl Scouts of the USA (GSUSA), our national organization, requires a \$25 nonrefundable annual fee to register as a girl or adult member. Registered members are covered by GSUSA's accident insurance when participating in Girl Scout activities. Parents, guardians, and other adults are also invited to become members of the Girl Scout movement.



FINANCIAL assistance

Financial assistance is available to families to supplement the cost of membership dues. Girl Scout Juliettes can also apply for financial assistance, which helps offset fees for ocuncil-sponsored events including travel and summer camp opportunities. product *programs*

Girl Scouts of Colorado offers two annual product programs: the Girl Scout Cookie Program and the Fall Product Program (which include nuts, chocolates, and magazines).

Girl Scouts participate in the Fall Product Program during the months of Spetember and October and in the Girl Scout Cookie Program during the months of January, February, and March.

Juliettes are eligible to receive rewards for participation in the product programs, including Cookie Credits, however they are not eligible to receive additional proceeds.

Cookie Credits may not be used to pay for/renew membership, pay fees to outside vendors for individual girls, purchase items not in the Girl Scout Shop, or pay for travel expenses for adults or those not related to Girl Scouts of Colorado. Contact the product sales team or email financial.followup@gscolorado.org for any questions or clarification regarding what Cookie Credits can be used for.

The parent or guardian of a Juliette will act as her Troop Fall Sale Manager (TFSM) or Troop Cookie Manager (TCM) if she chooses to participate in one or both of the product programs. Training will be provided for each role and service unit level product program volunteers will be available for assistance with each program.









SHOP

UNIFORMS & INSIGNIA

The Girl Scout uniform is optional; a girl doesn't need to have a uniform to be a member of the Girl Scouts of Colorado. Uniforms are available for purchase at the GSCO Shop. You can find information explaining the uniform and where to place insignia in *The Girl's Guide to Girl Scouting*. While there are many parts to the uniform, you can just wear the sash, vest, or tunic over regular clothing.

Girls desire to contribute to the world in purposeful and meaningful ways, learn how to identify problems in the community, and create "action plans" to solve them

Get Out & Camp

Girl Scouts of Colorado offers various types of organized camping opportunities: day camp, summer resident camp, and family camp. We offer overnight summer camp at Sky High Ranch and Tomahawk Ranch in 3-, 6-, 9- and 12-day sessions. Girls register by themselves or with a buddy and are placed in groups of 6 to 24 based on age and program activities.

. TOMAHAWK RANCH

Tomahawk Ranch is located in Bailey and is home to a small animal farm, a greenhouse, and year-round programs, including a summer resident camp. Tomahawk Ranch is good for all ages and beginner campers.

. SKY HIGH RANCH

Sky High Ranch, located in Woodland Park, has a zip line, low ropes course, archery, and a small animal farm. Sky High Ranch has rustic camping and hosts a summer resident camp.

Girl Scouting's Highest AWARDS



The Bronze, Silver, and Gold Awards are the highest achievements in Girl Scouting. They charge girls with identifying problems and issues in their community and taking the lead to make a sustainable change. Juniors in 4th and 5th grade can earn the Bronze Award, Cadettes in 6th – 8th grade can earn the Silver Award, and Seniors and Ambassadors in 9th – 12th grade can earn the Gold Award. All Highest Awards can be earned by Girl Scout Juliettes, though all girls (regardless of being a Juliette or in a troop) are asked to work with others and be in a position of leadership when earning their Bronze, Silver, or Gold.

Any girl interested in pursuing her Gold Award is required to attend a GSCO-sponsored Gold Award Training either online or in person. All Gold Award training opportunities are posted to our events calendar.

Deadlines

Highest Awards must be completed by the end of the membership year for the appropriate Girl Scout level. This means all girls have the summer after they complete the last year of their Girl Scout level to earn their award.

- September 30 of the year the girl completes 5th grade for Bronze.
- September 30 of the year the girl completes 8th grade for Silver.
- **September 30** of the year the girl completes 12th grade for Gold.

Highest Award Celebrations

All girls who earn their Bronze, Silver, or Gold are invited to participate in GSCO's Highest Awards celebrations each spring. To be included in these celebrations, girls must have completed their Highest Award and notified council of completion by March 1 annually.

- Provide funds for special events and activities or request financial assistance from council.
- Support your daughter's commitment to the Girl Scout Juliette Program.
- Help your daughter participate in Girl Scout Product Programs by following safety guidelines and helping her check over her orders.
