- **Check in is 3:00 PM** (MST) the first day of your reservation.
- **Check-out is 12:00 PM**(MST) the last day of your reservation
- If you have any questions or problems during your stay please call the Site Manager
- The lockbox with the keys for the property is located on the gate. The two lockboxes are connected together, use the one labeled 'Troop'.
- Please keep the gate closed during your stay.
- As soon as you arrive, please turn on the hot water. The switch is located in the kitchen next to the microwave.
- Guests must check fire bans in the area if they are planning on having any outdoor flames. The Jefferson County Fire Information Hotline phone number is 303-271-8200.
- For road conditions please visit <u>cotrip.org</u> for up to date information.

Parking

- There is parking for eight to ten vehicles at Twisted Pine; guests are encouraged to carpool if needed.
- If additional parking is needed for an event please contact the site manager to arrange different options.
- No RVs are permitted on Girl Scout property.

Our Property

Kitchen Facilities

Twisted Pine's kitchen is fully stocked and ready for use. It includes two stoves, oven, microwave, and refrigerator, as well as small appliances and paper towels. Pots, pans, dishes, and utensils are all supplied in the kitchen. Guests will need to bring food, seasonings, tin foil, and other disposable products. Dish towels are provided at Twisted Pine, please leave towels over dish rack when leaving to let dry. Cupboards are labeled, please insure all cookware is put back in right place when checking out.



Bedrooms



There are three bedrooms at Twisted Pine, which have mattresses to be used on the floor for sleeping accommodations. Guests may also choose to sleep outdoors in tents if they desire. Two small, basic tents are available for use. There are heating vents on the floor in the bedrooms, be sure not to place any mattresses on top of them. Heat is controlled with the two thermostats, one by the bathroom and one by the fireplace. Please lower to 60 degrees at checkout.

Bathroom Facilities

Twisted Pine is equipped with running water, and has two toilets, three sinks and a shower. The shower is for adult use only. There is a limited supply of water—please be cautious with your water use. Hand soap, toilet paper and basic cleaning supplies are provided, a small amount of paper towels are provided, please bring additional if needed.



Fire Pit and Indoor Fireplace



Twisted Pine has an outdoor fire pit with grates provided for outdoor cooking, as well as an indoor fireplace. Be sure to bring pre-wrapped/purchased firewood and sticks for roasting marshmallows! Absolutely no cooking is permitted on the back porch of Twisted Pine. Fire safety: There is a water jug under the bench in the main room that must be full while using the fire pit. Be sure that all fires are extinguished after use. Please note that there is no flue or damper fireplace. Guests will need to clean the ashes out of the fireplace and fire pit before use, and dump extinguished ashes in the Dumpster.

Safety and First Aid

Guests are responsible for the health and safety of all members of their group. Each group must have at least one person who has taken the Overnight Trips training, and who has read the following safety procedures. Additional safety information can be found in our <u>Handbook for Site Users</u>, including what to do in the case of an emergency.


- Proper adult to girl ratios as found in <u>Volunteer Essentials</u> should be maintained at all times. Adults must be 18 or older and children must be supervised at all times.
- Adults supervising additional children that are not part of the Girl Scout group, cannot be included as a supervising adult in the adult to girl ratio.
- The group leader is responsible for the supervision and conduct of all group members. The Site Manager or Camp Director, where applicable, cannot take responsibility for children who arrive early or leave late. Every participant must have a health history and a signed consent to treat form carried by their leader. The leader should have a list of all participants on site.
- Each group must have at least one adult who is First Aid/CPR certified, this person is responsible for providing first aid for their group. Each group must bring their own First Aid kit with them, with all supplies that may be needed.
- For large events, the first aid representative from the hosting group can help. Site Managers and Camp Staff living at camp are not responsible for first aid in any circumstances.
- Medications that need to be administered should be managed by the troop leader: be sure to pack anything over the counter you might need, plus anything that parents have given you to administer to their child.
- Keep medications stored in a secure place away from access of any children. Make sure all adults know the location of applicable emergency medications such as epi-pens and inhalers.
- All locked buildings, pastures, barns, sheds, ropes courses, zip lines, and other areas as posted, are off-limits, unless accompanied by a GSCO employee and arrangements are made ahead of time.
- Food should be kept in ice chests, wooden or metal boxes, car trucks, or "bear bags". Never keep food in tents, tabins, or seasonal units. Animals and insects are attracted to food and garbage and are not deterred by plastic, paper, or fabric.
- Tent campers should choose their area carefully. Make sure all tents are visible from the leader's tent. Avoid placing tents under trees. Space should be left around each tent to walk without tripping over ropes. Ropes should be marked with cloth strips or foil. Do not trench around tents.
- Use established roads, trails and fire circles. Mountain terrain is delicate and we all share responsibility for preserving it.
- Do not harm, touch, or feed the wildlife. This includes birds and squirrels.
- Prior to camp, review procedures with children of what to do if they become lost or separated from the group.
- Designate a meeting spot at every site you are staying at or visiting.
- If a camper is missing, look in logical places first and be systematic when searching. Get a description of lost camper and search in pairs while keeping sight and sound of each other. Notify the Site Manager/Camp Staff if child is not found in 15 minutes, then call parents and emergency numbers (posted by the phone).
- All guests must carry a flashlight at night.
- Guests should not wear sandals outside of buildings.
- Running is only permitted on playing fields, and should not be done in any other area of the camp.

- Genesee Park—Denver's largest Mountain Park, with picnicking, bison-watching, and incredible views.

Clean Up

Guests are expected to clean up after their use. Girl Scouts should leave places cleaner than they left them. Be sure to complete all of the following:

- Vacuum rugs and empty both vacuum chambers afterwards.
- Take down all crafts and ensure both inside and outside are clean of any artwork.
- Sweep and mop each room
 - Brooms, mops and mop bucket are in the closet next to the bathroom
 - Mop water will need to be changed at least once during cleaning, mop water can be dumped out in the parking lot
 - Rinse and squeeze mop heads, store mop head up in the closet.
 - <u>Do not leave wet mops in bucket</u>
- Wipe down all tables, table cloths and counters
 - Cleaners and sponges are under the kitchen sink
 - Do not use bathroom sponges in the kitchen
- Wash, dry and put away all dishes
 - Sponge for cleaning dishes is in the sink
 - Do NOT use dish soap on the cast iron
 - Cast iron must be scrubbed with hot water and towel-dried
- Wipe out microwave and refrigerator
- Do not pour grease down sink
 - Pour cooled grease in cans and dispose of in Dumpster (cans not provided)
- Clean bathroom sinks, mirrors and toilets
 - Bathroom sponges are under the sink in the bathroom
- Stack mattresses
- Collect and take all trash to the dumpster in the parking lot
 - Do not leave trash on top of Dumpster
 - Put trash completely in dumpster and lock it securely so wildlife will not be able to open it
 - Replace all trash bags
 - Small trash bags for the bathroom are under the bathroom counter

Please note that failure to complete the cleaning required may result in groups being charged a cleaning fee.

Check Out

Please be sure to complete the following items upon your departure:

- Turn both thermostats to 60 degrees.
 - There are two thermostats, one by the fireplace, one by the bathroom.
 - Please take ALL food you brought and leave any ice in the sink to melt.
- Make sure that all windows are closed and locked
 - Windows open from both the top and the bottom
- Turn off the hot water switch
- Lock all doors from the outside
 - Note: the door handles will turn regardless of being locked or unlocked.
 - Unlock top lock first on the front door and keep key on you at all times as the door closes on its own and will lock you out (site managers number is on lockbox in case of an emergency).
- Close the gate and secure with the chain and lock
- Return the keys to the lock box
 - Put the keys in upside to ensure the lock box closes
 - Do not put new key chains on the keys or the lock box will not close properly

Driving Directions

From Denver

- Take I-70 West toward Grand Junction
- Take Exit 254 for Genesee Park, turning left at the top of the off ramp over the highway.
- Turn right at the T in the road on S Genesee Mountain Road (into Genesee Mountian Park)
- Follow the road for 1.3 miles, and turn left on Genesee Ave
 - There will be a no-trespassers sign at the intersection
 - If you arrive at the park you have gone too far
- Twisted Pine is the first stone lodge on the left side of the road, with a metal gate at the entrance to the parking lot (do not turn right onto Twisted Pine Road)
 - If you reach a dirt road or pass the large parking lot with the stone picnic house you have gone too far
