



2026 Fall Product Program Juliette Deposit Instructions

Caregivers act as fall product managers, or “TFPMs” for their Girl Scout Juliette when they participate in the Fall Product Program.

Girl Scouts participate in the program by selling nuts and candies using a paper order card and/or setting up an online storefront in M2, that also has nuts and candies, as well as other products for sale. Customers that order items through Girl Scout online storefronts pay when they place the order. When using the order card, Girl Scouts collect money from customers for the items they have selected and deliver those items to customers within a few weeks after the program ends.

All Fall Product Program order card money collected by Girl Scout Juliettes belongs to Girl Scouts of Colorado (GSCO) and should be submitted to council.

Juliette caregiver TFPMs are responsible for submitting the order card order money collected to GSCO, by placing an online Girl Delivered order through your Girl Scout Juliette’s M2 storefront for all order card orders (as one order) and paying for the order. Doing so is how you “deposit” the order money collected, and how you pay Girl Scouts of Colorado for the nut and candy products to fulfill customer orders.

- ✓ Double check that all items on the order card are noted in the M2 girl delivery order.
- ✓ Make sure the total amount owed matches the total amount collected.

If you have questions or need assistance, please contact your service unit fall product manager (SUFPM) before the Sunday, Oct. 25, 8 p.m. deadline. All paper order card orders must be entered into M2. *No late orders will be accepted.*

If alternative order payment arrangements are needed, Juliette caregiver TFPMs must contact Stephanie Sanders, GSCO product program admin, as soon as possible and no later than Friday, Oct. 30, 2026.

Failure to pay council for nut and candy products and/or to communicate with council regarding product payments, puts the Juliette caregiver TFPM at risk of being referred to a collection agency for the debt and could be pursued to maximum extent of the law.
