## Prior to camp

- Have copies on hand of all group participants/visitors health history and signed consent to treat ([child form](#); [adult form](#))
- Have copies on hand of participants/visitors GSCO [photo release](#)
- Have copies on hand of activity liability waivers for participants

## Arrival Process

- For road conditions please visit [cotrip.com](http://cotrip.com) for up to date information.
- **Check in as early as 3pm.**
- When you arrive, the gate should be closed. You will need to use the call box. The box operates like a walkie-talkie, you will have to hold the button while speaking.
- A member of staff will answer your call box call and provide you with instructions.



## Parking

- After you have received your instructions from the Tomahawk Staff you can proceed to your cabin.
- We ask that only 2 vehicles be parked outside your designated cabin and that they are not blocking the porch or entrance to the cabin. This allows emergency vehicles ease of access in the event of an emergency. All other vehicles should park in the main parking lot.
- All roads at Tomahawk are one lane: please drive slowly and watch for on-coming vehicles (speed limit 15mph).
- We strongly suggest that during the snow season (September through April) guests only bring all-wheel or front-wheel drive vehicles. All roads at Tomahawk are dirt and may be muddy or difficult to drive on.
- GSCO staff is not permitted to tow vehicles for any reason.

## Safety and First Aid

Group Leaders are responsible for the health and safety of all members of their group.

Each group must have at least one person who is First Aid/CPR trained and who has read the following safety procedures.

Additional safety & site information can be found in the white binder provided on the kitchen counter inside your cabin, including what to do in the case of an emergency.

We ask that every participant reviews the information provided upon arrival.

- Proper adult to girl ratios as found in [Volunteer Essentials](#) should be maintained at all times. Adults must be 18 or older and all children must be supervised at all times.
- Adults supervising additional children that are not part of the Girl Scout group, CANNOT be included as a supervising adult in the adult to girl ratio.
- The Group Leader is responsible for the supervision and conduct of all group members. Due to licensing restrictions, Camp Staff cannot take responsibility for children during shoulder season programming. Every visitor/participant must have a health history and a signed consent to treat form carried by the group leader. The leader should have a list of all visitors/participants on site.
- Each group must have at least one adult who is First Aid/CPR certified, this person is responsible for providing first aid for their group. Each group must bring their own First Aid kit with them, with all supplies that may be needed.
- Due to licensing restrictions, Camp Staff are not to provide general first aid/health care in any circumstance.
- Medications that need to be administered should be managed by the Group Leader or parent/guardian: be sure to pack anything over the counter you might need.
- Keep medications stored in a secure place away from access of any children. Make sure all adults know the location of applicable emergency medications such as epi-pens and inhalers.
- All locked buildings, pastures, barns, sheds, ropes courses, zip lines, and other areas as posted, are off-limits, unless accompanied by a member of Camp Staff.
- All food should be kept inside your cabin.
- Use established roads, trails and fire circles. Mountain terrain is delicate and we all share responsibility for preserving it.
- Do not harm, touch, or feed the wildlife. This includes birds and squirrels.
- Prior to camp, review procedures with children of what to do if they become lost or separated from the group.
- Designate a meeting spot while on-site. We recommend your cabin.
- If a camper is missing, look in logical places first and be systematic when searching. Get a description of lost camper and search in pairs while keeping sight and sound of each other. Notify the Camp Staff if child is not found in 15 minutes, then call emergency numbers (posted by the phone).

## Sharing the Site

There are permanent human and animal residents who live at Tomahawk Ranch year-round, please respect their privacy. Our donkeys, cats and goats free range throughout the property & are all up to date on all vaccinations. They are friendly, however please do not feed and use caution when saying hi, as they are still animals.

## Clean Up

- Girl Scouts should be sure to leave places as clean or cleaner than they found them. We ask that all members of the group respect the site and environment.
- All visitors/participants must clean their cabins before leaving. Cleaning procedures, checklists and helpful tips can be found inside the white binder. Group Leaders are responsible for maintaining a clean and tidy visitation & monitoring clean up and making sure that chemicals are used responsibly.

## Departure Process

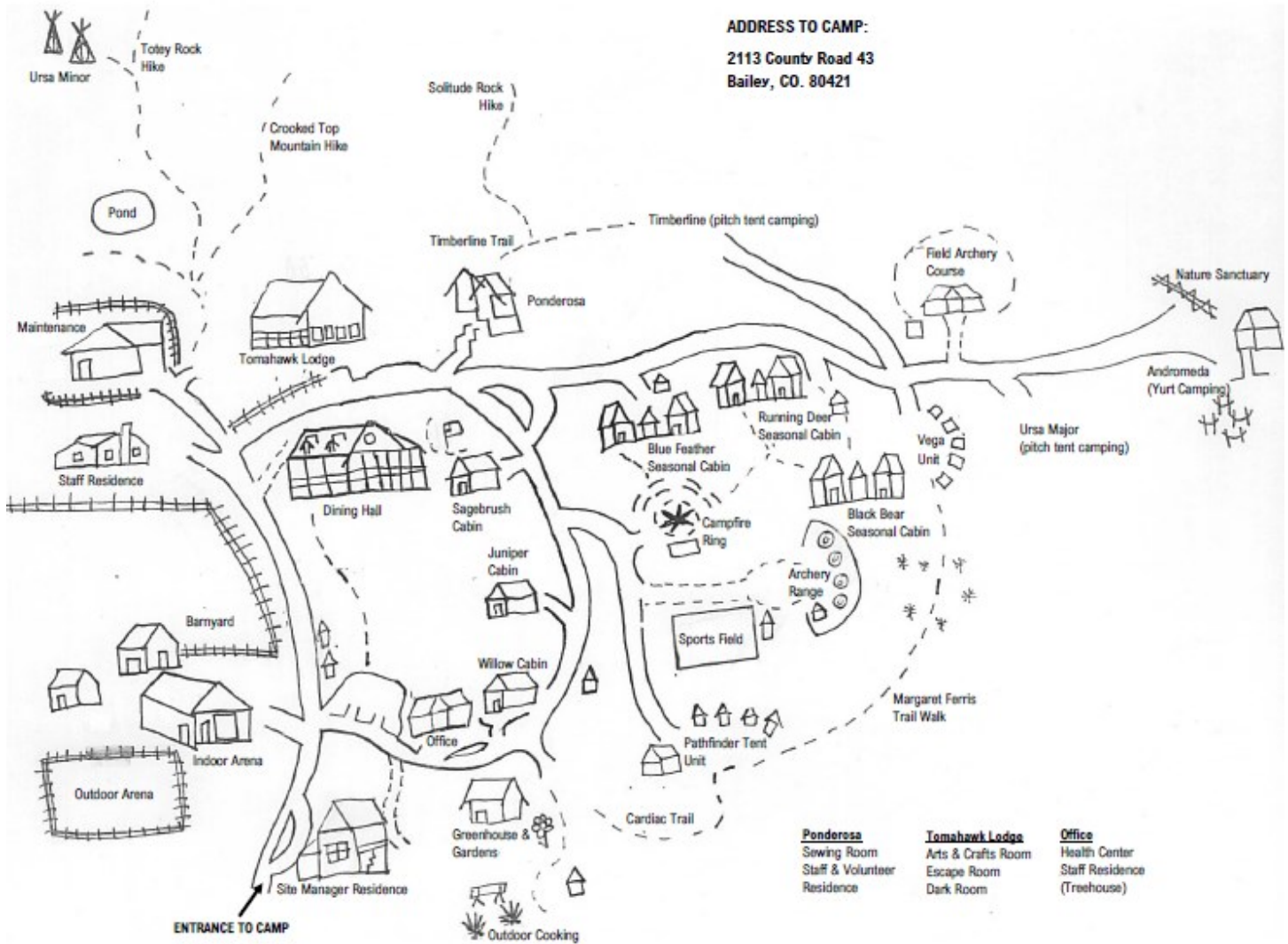
- Prior to departure, please notify Camp Staff of what time you plan to check-out. Also notify staff of any questions or concerns which arose during your stay.

# Driving Directions

## From Denver:

1. Take Hampden Ave/Highway 285 South, toward Bailey.
2. Follow Highway 285 approximately 12.5 miles past Aspen Park.
3. Turn right at County Road 43. There will be a stop light at this intersection, and you will see a gas station on the right side of the road.
4. If you reach the town of Bailey, you have gone too far.
5. Follow County Road 43 for approximately 2.5 miles, past Deer Creek Elementary School.
6. Tomahawk Ranch is the next left after the school. You will see a Tomahawk Ranch sign at a wood gate.
7. The road into the camp is a one lane, dirt road. Please drive slowly and carefully.

## From the Western Slope:

1. Take Highway 285 North, towards Bailey/Denver.
2. Continue on Highway 285 North for 3.5 miles past Bailey.
3. Turn left on County Road 43 at the stop light. There is a gas station on the left side of the road.
4. If you reach Pine Junction , then you have gone too far.
5. Follow County Road 43 for approximately 2.5 miles, past Deer Creek Elementary School.
6. Tomahawk Ranch is the next left after the school. You will see a Tomahawk Ranch sign at a wood gate.
