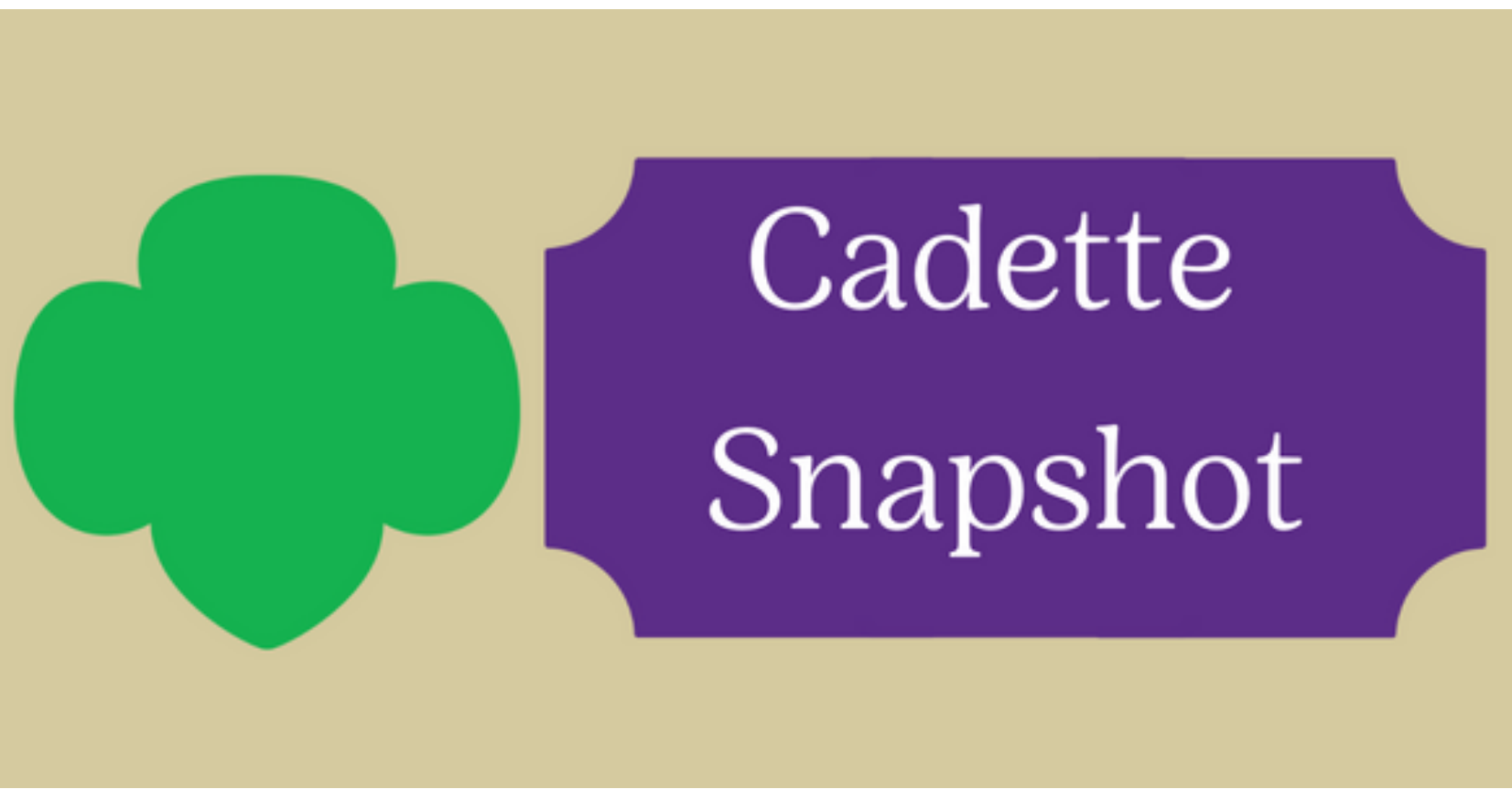




Cadette Snapshot is a newsletter for Girl Scout families.

### Highest Awards Deadline

Reminder! The deadline for Girl Scouts to complete their Highest Awards and attend the regional celebrations in May is March 31. Bronze and Silver Award candidates must have their final report submitted by March 31. Gold Award Candidates must have their final presentation completed and approved by March 31, but the final report is due at least two weeks before their scheduled presentation date. Invitations for regional celebrations will be sent in February and March to eligible Girl Scouts. Those who do not finish by March 31 have until Sept. 30, 2025, to complete their awards and will be invited to the celebrations in spring 2026.
