




Junior Snapshot is a newsletter for Girl Scout families.

New this year: Beyond Boundaries, day camp for older campers. Based out of Girl Scout DreamLab in Denver, Adventures in Nature: Beyond Boundaries is a camp designed for sixth – 10th graders looking to try new and exciting activities each day! From ropes courses to water sports to rock climbing, this camp has a little bit of everything for campers who are ready to take their outdoor skills to the next level.

**Adventures in Nature Day Camp**  
From birding to paddling, each location is unique and will have different activities. These camps are meant to encourage campers to learn about the wilderness around them, create fun experiences in our natural parks, and build confidence with each other in the great outdoors! Sessions are held at Barr Lake State Park, Bear Creek State Park, and Cherry Creek State Park.

Volunteer camps offer a lot of variety, from one-day-only programs to three-night troop camps, from paddling skills to outdoor cooking and science experiments, there's a perfect fit for everyone. GSCO offers overnight camps at Sky High Ranch and Tomahawk Ranch.

Sky High Ranch is a gorgeous mountainous camp near Woodland Park, about an hour from Colorado Springs, and two hours from Denver. At overnight camp at Sky High Ranch, campers might dip into a beautiful mountain pond one day, fly down the mountain on a zipline another day, and sleep beneath a million stars by night. They'll experience life away from it all, make new friends, learn some crazy camp songs, meet cool counselors from all over the world, and get to know some pretty cool barn animals too.

Tomahawk Ranch is a beautiful sunny property near Bailey, about an hour from Denver and two hours from Fort Collins and Colorado Springs. Explore the Rocky Mountains on horseback, gaze at the stars, enjoy a s'more, and have an amazing outdoor adventure!
