Gold Award training is now on gsLearn!



All Seniors and Ambassadors who want to start their Gold Award project, must complete Gold Award training through gsLearn. We are no longer providing recordings of the training to girls or volunteers and are requiring that everyone go through gsLearn to complete the training pre-requisite.

Accessing Gold Award Training through gsLearn
Girl Scouts must submit the [Gold Award Training Request Form](#) to get started. This form is linked to the top of the [Gold Award webpage](#) for Girl Scouts to access at any time. Girls should allow up to one week after submitting the form to access gsLearn. Once the form is submitted, they will receive an email with instructions on how to access gsLearn and the training.

In order to register for Go Gold and start working on their initial proposals Girl Scouts need to complete the required Journey(s) prior to submitting their initial proposal in Go Gold.
