


Snapshot is a newsletter for Girl Scout families.



Even though President Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation officially ending slavery in 1863, in practice slavery remained in some parts of the country. On June 19, 1865, word that the Civil War was over and slavery was abolished finally made it to enslaved people in Galveston, Texas—and celebrations throughout the newly free Black community followed, which in time became an annual tradition across the United States Let's recognize Juneteenth with joy and a commitment to the ongoing fight for freedom!
