

Travel Peak Learning Pathway



Whether you travel around the world or around the block, some of the most memorable moments in a Girl Scout's life happen while taking trips!

Our online learning pathway is designed to prepare you for your troop's biggest adventure yet! Girl Scouts is a great place to learn how to plan and take trips! Traveling is built upon a progression of activities and girl-led processes.

Troops are strongly encouraged to go through the progression process together.

Descriptions of the travel courses and how they progress:

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| Pack Your Bags! <i>Introduction</i> | This course is a brief introduction to the Travel Peak Learning Pathway. You will be introduced to the Girl Scout Leadership Experience and how that applies to the travel progression. It is required before continuing the Travel Peak Learning Pathway. |
| Base <i>Field & Day Trips</i> | The first step of travel as a Girl Scout, Field Trips & Outings. These are day trips around your neighborhood or day long events. Some examples of these activities include visiting a community park or recreation center or planning a trip to your local zoo! |
| Slope <i>Overnights</i> | Overnights are 1-2 nights with your troop either staying in a hotel, having a sleepover in a museum, a troop camp, or camping*. They are a short distance away from your community, yet far enough away to experience being away from home. |
| Ridge <i>Regional & National Trips</i> | Regional trips are 3+ nights and can start with a trip within Colorado, then expand to different areas of the U.S. These can be camping* or backpacking*, glamping, or urban trips where you stay in a hotel! Your troop can plan their own adventure or take advantage of a pre-planned Girl Scout Destination, Getaway, or Troop Trek! |
| Summit <i>International Trips</i> | International travel is an exciting experience for girls to share with their troop! Planning for international travel should start at least 2 years in advance. If they are planning their own troop trip, this will provide time for the troop to earn troop funds, plan an itinerary, and make reservations. Planning a trip to one of the four Girl Scout World Centers is a great place to start, there are also pre-planned trips troops can participate in! |
| Valley <i>Enrichments & Resources</i> | This course is full of travel enrichments and different resources discussed throughout the Travel Peak Learning Path. Here you will find the GS Safety Checkpoints document, as well as helpful links to different GS Travel sites. Upon finishing the Travel Peak, or one or more of the courses within, please participate in the feedback course so we can continue improving the learning experience for our volunteers! |
