Girl Scouts of all ages can complete at least three of the seven activities listed below within 12 months and earn the Colorado Women's Hall of Fame (CWHF) patch. Once activities are completed, troop leader, parent, or guardian should fill out the [online notification form](#) and patches will be mailed to an address of their choosing.

All Girl Scouts should take the [Girl Scout Internet Safety Pledge](#) before starting their online research.

### Patch Activities (complete at least 3 in a 12-month period)

- Complete the CWHF [scavenger hunt](#) (answers will be posted to the GSCO blog)
- Select a specific [Inductee from the CWHF website](#) to research, answer the following two questions about, and share your answers with your troop, service unit, or another group of girls in your life:
  1. What did you discover or realize from this activity?
  2. What is the most remarkable thing you learned about the woman/women you researched?
- Watch one of the [films on the CWHF website](#), answer the following questions, and share your answers with your troop, service unit, or another group of girls in your life:
  1. What surprised you the most during this activity?
  2. How did the woman/women you learned about in this activity demonstrate passion?
- Listen to one of the [podcasts on the CWHF website](#) (scroll to the bottom of the page for a full list of available podcasts), answer the following questions, and share your answers with your troop, service unit, or another group of girls in your life:
  1. What obstacles or challenges did the woman/women you learned about have to overcome?
  2. How might overcoming obstacles or challenges affect your dreams and your future?
- Visit a [historic site](#) that has a connection to one of the CWHF inductees and share your experience on the Girl Scouts of Colorado blog, Facebook, or Instagram pages.
  - Girls ages 13 or under, ask a parent or guardian for help sharing your story online.

- Visit a [History Colorado Museum](#) or other museum and share what you learned with your troop, service unit, or another group of girls in your life.
- Attend a [CWHF event](#) and share your experience with your troop, service unit, or another group of girls in your life.
